Below you will find the course syllabus and some further information about the course.

Introduction:

The BC Centre for Excellence in HIV/AIDS has developed this online course for diverse teams of clinicians, providers and support services. This course provides an introduction to providing care and support for people living with HIV, using an interprofessional framework.

Course Requirements:

The course is an open enrollment course, which allows participants to register at any time during the year. Also, no cost is incurred.

Please note, that this course is tailored to health care professionals and community workers who would like an introduction to providing care and support for people living with HIV.

Course Objectives:

Upon completion of this course, participants will be able to:

- Understand the relevance HIV/AIDS history to patient care
- Learn how professionals from various disciplines collaborate in HIV care (interprofessional care teams)
- Be able to talk with patients about HIV tests and results
- Understand the concepts of risk and vulnerability and implications for patient care
- Learn about the role of peer navigators in HIV care
- Be able to assess and talk with patients about treatment readiness
- Understand the importance of listening to patients and developing supportive relationships

Course Design:

- This online course is hosted through BC Centre for Excellence in HIV/AIDS Education and Training Website
- The course content is divided into 8 learning modules
- Each module consists of a specific learning topic
- The course content for each topic consists of PowerPoint presentations and videos.
- There are 6 multiple-choice quizzes
- Links to clinical resources, guidelines and additional references

Learning Modules:

Duration of the course & Quizzes:

The course will take you between 5 and 8 hours to complete, depending on your own speed. At the end of each module, there is a quiz to give you feedback on your learning progress.

Course Assessments/Quizzes:

In order to receive a certificate of completion, all 6 quizzes are required to be completed, with a minimum grade of 70%. Each quiz is composed of multiple-choice questions that are related to the content of the learning module. The course assessments have been designed so that students can review the material during the quiz if necessary.
